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Editor's Corner:

Step 3: "Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him."

I need to remember that turning my will over to the care of my Higher Power does not mean I give up my "free will." I can fall into the trap of equating my "free will" with my "self will." They are not the same.

I have never heard anyone say that their "free will" ran riot. It is my "self will" that gets me in trouble. My "self will" originates and operates from a place of arrogance and stubbornness. I think I know what is right for the whole world and specifically the people closest to me. I grew up with parents who "knew" what was best for me; how I should think, feel, act, and that also applied to God. My God was created by someone else. My God was remote, judgmental and someone to be feared.

When I became an adult, I was in charge of me, and I thought I knew what others should be saying, doing, believing, and thinking. I became the adult that was modeled for me by my parents. It's so easy for me to fall into that trap even today. As much as I hated having all this control imposed on me by others, I can still act the same sick way towards others. My "self will" runs riot.

My "free will' emanates from a place of thought and consideration, a place of openness and awareness. "Free will" is a gift from my Higher Power and can only operate when I reflect on my options, pray for guidance and trust that I will receive that "nudge" from my Higher Power when the time is right for me to make a choice. When I make a decision in this way, I am exercising my "free will." I am using this precious gift from my Higher Power.

Today my Higher Power is a God of my understanding and beyond my understanding. My Higher Power is not stagnant, but fluid and evolving. My relationship with this Power is the same; it is a living thing.

Today I trust that my Higher Power meets me where I am, not where I or anyone else thinks I should be. I don't have to have myself all neat and together to turn to this Power. I can turn to my Higher Power whatever emotional state I might be in. This even applies to those times of deep doubt and confusion. I sometimes wonder about whether or not this God really exists. But I do know that I and my life function so much better when I put those doubts aside and trust that I have a Higher Power who is always available to me. I make a decision to turn my will and my life over to this Power.



Forum Article:

I Am Learning to Breathe

I've always approached life with an attitude of, "If I just hand in there long enough, things will work themselves out. Everything will be okay." I think there's a grain of truth in this attitude, but it's just a tiny grain.

How Al-Anon Works (B-22), p. 47, talks about perseverance. In Al-Anon, I'm learning how to "Live and Let Live," to detach with love. These practices are similar to perseverance for me because they are not about giving up or leaving the person I love. If I "Live and Let Live," I accept the person or situation as is, and I focus on moving forward with my own life.

What I practiced before Al-Anon was not "moving forward with life." It was actually "not giving up and staying stuck in the same old place." Perseverance was my way of practicing the same behavior over and over, each time expecting a different result. My loved one would reach for the alcohol. I would be filled with dread, but then I'd tell myself, "Maybe this will be the last time," or "maybe he won't drink so much this time." I kept expecting things to become different - magically.

What I'm learning in Al-Anon is things don't magically become different unless I do some footwork. The first step is I have to fully admit there is a problem. Noticing a problem then holding my breath until it goes away is not going to cut it. I realize now that what I used to call perseverance was really just holding my breath. I wasn't living. I was just staying very quiet, not making any waves, and doing everything I could to keep the home functioning.

In Al-Anon, I pray, I read Conference Approved Literature, I go to meetings, and I work with a Sponsor. I don't really know who or what I pray to, but that's okay. It's all part of Al-Anon teaching me to breathe, to fully take life in, and move forward. In Al-Anon, I'm learning to live.

Dear Al-Anon Members,

In July 2018, we announced that a change was made to the At–Large Committee résumé submission deadline to allow adequate time for the process of review, recommendation and approval of the candidates to be finalized in April, so they can begin their assignment in May.

Résumés were due to the World Service Office (WSO) by January 1st However, we became aware that the information was not sufficiently disseminated.

To ensure that members who are interested in service have the opportunity to submit their candidacy this year, we are extending the deadline on a one-time basis to March 1, 2019.

As a reminder, At-Large members can live anywhere in the World Service Conference Structure: United States and Canada. Selected Committees require one-year time commitments which run from May to April each year.

The number of positions available annually is as follows:

- 5 At-Large members, Forum Editorial Advisory Committee
- 5 At-Large members, Literature Committee
- 5 At-Large members, Public Outreach Committee
- 2 At-Large members, Audit Committee

How Al-Anon Supports Alateen

We read the excerpt "Passing the Basket" from page 10 of the 2018/2021 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (P-24/27) at every meeting. This section reminds me that in Al-Anon/Alateen, there are no dues or fees, but that our voluntary contributions help to cover the group's expenses. Reading this section and passing the basket at every meeting is important because, while Alateen members may not have a lot of money, the spiritual act of contributing encourages them to become responsible with money and reinforces a sense of belonging.

Months later, we were invited to attend the Eastern Seaboard Alateen Conference. Thanks to the accumulated funds from the weekly contributions, we had some money, but not enough. Fortunately, the District had some funds for Alateen and thanks to this, three members, another Alateen Group Sponsor, and I were able to go. It was an amazing experience. The teens realized that Alateen encompasses more than just their home group.

Our group's membership has grown since then, and our Alateen members have had the opportunity to attend two Alateen conferences this year. For one of these events, the teens held a fundraising activity in collaboration with the District, as discussed on page 97 of the *Service Manual*, under "Events with Alateen Participation." It is important to note that contributions from Al-Anon members to Alateen are voluntary, whether the Alateen group is new or not. This support may end once the group becomes self-supporting.
